2. Elevator pitch

Write down a high level summary of your business/idea/product/service in max. 50 words.

3. Executive summary

Please describe the idea, the social benefit or the business opportunity for your solution, including the space connection, the target market, your competitive advantage and your business model.

4. Team

Introduce yourself and all your core team members. Please include a short introduction covering their current role, background and skills relevant for your solution. Please also mention any supporters you might have, such as mentors, supporting entities, investors, etc.

5. Space technology

- Which space technology do you (expect to) use?
- Which in-kind expertise are you looking for in terms of space technology?

6. Value proposition

Please describe the customer challenge and the solution you are offering, including the unique selling points and customer benefits or public value.

7. Product description

Provide a description of the technology that provides the innovative foundation for your business:

- Describe the main technical specifications and advantages of your solution, including how it improves on existing solutions. Describe whether you use Earth observation data and computing platforms.
- What added value does space technology/data bring to your solution?
- How do you use space technology/data in your solution?
- How ready your solution is for use and the market?
- Time to minimum viable product (MVP)
- Budget needed to MVP
- Time to technology readiness level (TRL) 9
- Budget to market launch
- Tell us if you own any patents or if you have acquired any licenses for your solution.
- What is your biggest technological challenge?

8. Market analysis

- Which sector are you addressing?
- Target market
- Route to market
- The competition

9. The business model

Describe how your project will create, deliver and capture value.

10. Information technology

- Are you delivering a data/software/information as a service to your customers?
- (optional) On which commercially available platforms and languages does it build and/or are there propriety (hardware/software) parts?
- Is a hardware device part of your solution?
- (optional) On which software is it operating and how does it link with the grid/cloud/other?

11. Support

- Which in-kind support services would you consider most beneficial for realising your solution?
- What would you like to learn/achieve during the Ignition Programme?

12. Timeline
